1. Viognier Aromo ~ Chile Very dry with an atypical spike of acidity. Very clean and fresh.	£4.20	£5.80	£16.20
2. Sauvignon Blanc Casa Io Matta ~ Chile Typical Sauvignon in character with zest and freshness.	£4.00	£5.60	£15.80
3. Pinot Grigio Vista Collina ~ Italy Light but fruity Pinot from Veneto.	£4.40	£5.90	£16.80
4. Muscadet Sur Lie Domaine du Poirier ~ France Very dry but with such superb mouthfeel from the lees ageing that it actually feels fatter in the mouth. Superb with fish.	£4.80	£6.30	£18.40
5. Chardonnay Aromo ~ Chile Full-flavoured and full-bodied with a distinctive weighty style.	£4.20	£5.80	£16.20

6. Merlot Rosé Aromo ~ Chile A little residual sugar on the finish lifts this beautifully coloured wine in a really attractive way.	£4.80	£5.60	£16.20
7. Sunkissed Rosé Douglas Green Bellingham ~ S.Africa Medium sweet rosé made to a lower strength of 8% by stopping fermentation early. Full-on fruit but with balancing acidity.	£4.20	£5.80	£16.20
8. Pinot Grigio Ramato Blush Antigniano ~ Italy Genuine Ramato Pinot is made by extracting the maximum possible colour from the skins and results in an onion skin colour rather than "pink". Full-bodied and flavoured, and beautifully presented.	£5.30	£7.10	£21.00

9. Cabernet Sauvignon Aromo ~ Chile Big and chewy style of Cabernet with clear varietal traits.	£4.20	£5.80	£16.20
10. Merlot Casa Io Matta ~ Chile Soft and mellow with herby character. What a find – a good, inexpensive Merlot.	£4.00	£5.60	£15.80
11. Shiraz Cabernet Lantana ~ Australia Full-bodied and rich red from the Trentham Estate in New South Wales.	£4.50	£6.30	£18.50
12. Rioja Tinto Ruiz de Viñaspre ~ Spain Fresh and unoaked entry Rioja. Bright and zippy.	£4.50	£6.30	£18.50

- 13. Riesling Coup de Foudre Bernhard & Reibel ~ France** £27.00
Riesling remains the unrecognised king of white grapes. Alsace is arguably the home of this variety and Pierre has created a bone dry, delicious wine. Great for drinking with most food, but particularly good with spicy flavours.
- 14. Grüner Veltliner Steinhaus Josef Grillmaier ~ Austria** £25.00
Josef visited Ipswich recently and showed his fantastic wines to us. A lovely man making lovely wines. The Steinhaus is a full-bodied but very minerally white. Gruner is a unique variety offering subtle but complex flavours.
- 15. Petit Chablis Les Temps Perdus ~ France** £28.00
Contrary to popular belief, the wines from Petit Chablis are not necessarily inferior to Chablis proper, it is so called because the area producing it is smaller. This wine was made by Clotilde Davenne from her own vineyard. She is a multi-award winning winemaker.
- 16. Gavi Grosso ~ Italy** £26.00
Piedmontese dry white made from the local Cortese grape variety. Very dry and with a zip of acidity followed by a slightly nutty finish.
- 18. Sauvignon Blanc Herringbone Hills ~ New Zealand** £25.00
Marlborough Sauvignon at its best positively bursts with flavour. This example has that fantastic typicity but also tantalising restraint.
- 19. Sancerre Vieilles Vignes Thomas Labaille ~ France** £29.50
Vieilles Vignes means old vines and reduced yields. Here it is possible to see the effect in great concentration and intensity. Very full bodied.

- 20. Château Vieux Parc Corbières ~ France** £23.50
Lovely soft red from the South of France. Another great example of French winemakers listening to the drinkers.
- 21. Pinot Noir Trentham ~ Australia** £26.80
Rich and ripe yet still retaining that lovely green stalkiness that makes red Burgundy so sought after.
- 22. Château Tour de Grenet Lussac-St. Emilion ~ France** £32.50
This is the level at which serious Claret really starts to shine. A real taste of the terroir with a lovely gravelly attack followed by austere fruit and good length.
- 23. Fleurie Collin Bourisset ~ France** £28.00
Crisp and fresh tasting as good Fleurie should be. Really top quality.
- 24. Rioja Reserva Ruiz de Viñaspre ~ Spain** £32.50
Smooth and mature - big style and quality here. The extra oak ageing results in even more smoothness and texture.
- 25. Urban Malbec Uco Valley O'Fournier ~ Argentina** £23.50
Rich, dense red from high altitude vineyards in the up-and-coming Uco Valley. Strong and savoury.
- 26. Barolo Tre Ciabot Cascina Ballarin ~ Italy** £47.00
Monster red from the Piemonte region of Northern Italy. All the ingredients; weight, alcohol, fruit, acidity and tannins are on a large scale but the balance is fantastic.

sweet

27. **Noble Taminga Trentham ~ Australia** 37.5cl £19.00
Sweet and rich dessert wine with good acidity balance.

sparkling

28. **Prosecco Extra Dry Marsuret ~ Italy** £27.50
Delightful northern Italian sparkler from the local Prosecco variety. A lovely sweetness on the finish adds class.
29. **Caprice Brut Rosé ~ France** £27.50
A style of wine that is really taking off. Dry with a mid pink colour and a real spring in it's step.

champagne

30. **Paul Clouet Rosé** £46.00
This pink Champagne has a beautiful onion skin colour and lovely dry attack on the palate. Finishes long and clean.
31. **Paul Clouet Grand Cru** £45.00
Half Bottle £24.00
Produced solely from Grand Cru vineyards and in relatively small quantities, this beautifully presented Champagne is rich and full-flavoured with great length and style. The fizz is exceptionally gentle but long-lasting. Recommended.
32. **Laurent Perrier Rosé** £75.00
A beautiful bottle presentation and an unusual, almost bluey pink coloured wine.
33. **Moët & Chandon Brut Imperial** £49.00
Justifiably famous wine from the biggest Champagne producer.
34. **Veuve Clicquot Yellow Label** £55.00
One of the more famous Grand Marque Champagnes, has developed a loyal following through the Brand's sponsorship of high profile events.
